

TQ26 - Bio Security

All horses attending TQ26 must present with a Temperature log as per AERA Biosecurity Plan

All horses attending the TQ26 Ride base must first check-in at the Bio Security Checkpoint, located at Imbil Showgrounds, Edward Street, Imbil. As you come into Imbil you will turn left on to Edward Street after the school. Our checkpoint will be beyond the arena.

Opening hours for the Biosecurity Checkpoint are –

- Monday 29 June – 12 noon to 4.00 pm
- Tuesday 30 June – 9.00 am to 4.00 pm
- Wednesday 1 July – 9.00 am to 4.00 pm
- Thursday 2 July – 9.00 am to 3.00 pm

Your Horse Health Declaration will be collected and you will receive another form to complete temperatures to be taken each morning up to and including pre-ride vet inspections. You must present both forms when you attend pre-ride vetting.

Note that all horses must be on site by 4.00 pm on Thursday 2 July 2026.

The venue is in a Cattle Tick Infected Zone and An Accredited Certifier will be on site to offer spraying for horses returning to southern states. Booking and payment for this has been via the online nomination process. You should have booked this through AERA Online

Fodder (relevant to intrastate and interstate competitors):

- Any feed brought into the venue from Interstate must comply with Department requirements and a fodder declaration must be completed if required. Further information is at: <http://www.daf.qld.gov.au/plants/moving-plants-and-plant-products/into-or-within-queensland/bringing-fodder-or-hay-into-queensland>
- All fodder is to be removed from the site on departure.

Competitors are advised that:

- They have a biosecurity obligation to take all reasonable steps to ensure their activities do not spread a pest, disease or contaminant.
- Horse Health Declarations (HHD) are a mandatory requirement for this event.
- The property identification code (PIC) of the horse's origin and returning property must be included on the HHD.
- Acceptance into the event will be refused if the required HHD is not presented at point of entry or designated registration point.
- No horses with signs of illness are to be brought onto the grounds.
- Equipment, including food containers, is not to be shared between horses.
- Direct nose to nose contact between horses that are not regularly in contact should be minimised.
- Horse floats and trucks should be cleaned and disinfected before leaving to go to the event.
- Competitors are responsible for cleaning up manure from yards and placing it in designated areas.
- Competitors are required to advise the event organisers immediately if a horse is sick, to stop all non-essential contact with the sick horse and not allow anyone to have close contact with the sick horse.
- Everyone handling horses should wash or sanitise hands between contacting different horses.
